After a correction to the February minutes that there were 22 vendors confirmed, a motion was made by Terry Russell and seconded by Rick Glover to accept the February minutes. Motion passed by the club.

Treasurer Report: Terry Russell reported that the checkbook balance as of February 2013 was \$15,786.60.

Field Trip Report: April field trip will be to Probst farm. Harry Polly will send out information on the trip. Also mentioned was the club field trip to Kentucky to collect geodes. Ann Koebberling has made arrangements for the club to collect.

Education Committee: St. James in Denver, three classrooms at Oakwood Elementary was visited. Also, 30 Cub Scouts were presented to by Harry Polly. Catawba County Library has requested a program.

Show Committee: Show Chairman Baxter Leonard reported that:

- 6) A motion by Glen Bolick, seconded by Rick Glover to reimburse Eric Fritz \$200 for the 2013 Show Grand Door Prize. Motion passed by the club.
- 7) Saturday night of the show will be the Dealer's Dinner at PO BBQ at 7 PM hosted by Larry Huffman. The club will pay for the dealer's meal; club members attending will pay \$13.00.
- 8) Terry Russell reported that help with the ticket sales is still needed and to contact her if you can help.

New Business:


