Just a quick update on the Central Kentucky trip over Labor Day Weekend this year.

I talked to Clay the other day by email and he said we are welcome to return to his quarry in Danville on Saturday morning, Sept 2nd. I told Clay we would be adding something to our attire this year for the quarry visits, a reflective safety vest, similar to what deer hunters use here in Missouri during deer season. Some of us have been wearing them on various trips in the past few years, and I am now a big fan of this, so take the time to get one if you don't have one, before the Kentucky trip rolls around. We wear them here in Missouri on the druse quartz group digs in the forest areas, they can make a big difference in seeing someone, especially if they were to get turned around and lost.

I was doing some research and reading some club newsletters in the southeast and along the east coast, and many of them have a Field Trip Conduct page in their Club Info websites, some have Field Trip Etiquette pages with guidelines and rules, such as the following :

GENERAL FIELD TRIP CONDUCT --

Be on Time.

Have All Your Gear With You and Wearing It On Arrival At The Quarry. Sign Any Forms Required By The Quarry. Listen To The Quarry Guide/Manager During The Safety Talk. Abide By Any and All Rules Set By Quarry That We Are Visiting, Including MSHA Regulations.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT IN QUARRIES -- No Exceptions or Substitutions

Hard Hat Steel Toed Boots or Composite Toe/Boot/Shoes Safety Goggles / Glasses ANSI Rated Pants or Jeans - NO Shorts or Capri`s or Sweatpants Gloves Reflective Safety Vest

PHOTOS / VIDEOS, SOCIAL MEDIA, AND SALES OF SPECIMENS COLLECTED --

Quarry Managers I have talked to, that allow us entry to their quarries to collect at, have stated that videos and photos may be taken, but cannot be posted to social media sites if they show the location of the quarry, or if information containing the location of the quarry is on the video or photo, and certainly do not post videos or photos showing unsafe collecting at a quarry.

Many of us in this group, recently saw the backlash of this type of activity by a few former members of this group right after Memorial Day Weekend, and when I came across this info

posted in a club newsletter, it sounded pretty appropriate for my group going forward from here.

Videos and photos may be taken at a quarry if the Quarry Manager is alright with that, but may not be posted online with any information that identifies the quarry.

If you want to show off what you collected at the quarry, take photos or videos of the specimens after you get home and get them cleaned up, that way any metadata that includes the gps location of the quarry will not be viewed, and DO NOT post the name of the quarry or location of the quarry with your photos / videos.


If you sell any specimens from the trip, do not include the quarry name, address, or county.

I am mainly posting these guidelines and rules for newer members of my group, as most who have been in my group for the past few years, already comply with these guidelines and rules from years of experience and common sense. We also do not want to see the Quarry Managers receive any backlash for allowing rockhounds into their quarries, especially us. It takes alot of time to vet locations like this to gain access, so dont blow it by doing stupid things/actions. Showing up at the quarry with your required safety gear on, shows Quarry Managers and personnel present at the quarry, how serious you are about not only your safety, but the safety of others, and your actions alone, will further show them that you have respect for safety.

Onyx and I hope everyone is having a GREAT summer so far...two weeks ago we received about ten inches of rain spread out over ten days time...very much needed...and now we are back in the oven and trying to stay cool.

We have been scouting a few new locations for druse quartz in the past few weeks with some local rockhound friends, and have been very successful finding some new pieces in beautiful pinks, reds, rootbeer, yellows, oranges, and honey browns. I am attaching some photos of recent finds. I was also able to photograph a couple of young bucks this past weekend on my birthday, on the way to the new collecting spot.
