As indicated, this year's series will focus on each month's birthstone. I realize that several minerals may be associated with a particular month, but I am trying to select the most commonly accepted one for this series.

I welcome any information a member may wish to provide to be included in the upcoming newsletters each month corresponding to the particular month's birthstone.

March's Birthstone is Aquamarine.

Aquamarine is a variety of beryl and can be a blue or cyan color. It can occur at most locations which produce ordinary beryl. The color is due to different iron ions in the crystal structure. Dark blue beryl has the potential to form green, pink, or yellow beryl when irradiated.

Colors: Colors can range from blue to cyan.

Common Uses: Jewelry

Hardness: Mohs scale: 7.5-8.0




