





Although a beautiful scene, I can't help but turn my thoughts towards springtime and the chance to head off to see the spring blossoms that always greet us upon our arrival at Wildacres.

Not yet been to Wildacres? Are you ever missing a treat! Wildacres Retreat is a conference center that offers its facilities to non-profit groups such as the EFMLS who conduct educational or cultural programs. Situated on 1,600 acres on a mountain just off the Blue Ridge Parkway in Little Switzerland, NC (about an hour north of Asheville), the center includes a variety of classroom and meeting spaces, and about 60 double-occupancy bedrooms, each with a private bath. Leaning.




Bookshelf Specimen
