Hardness - A measure of the resistance of a mineral to being scratched by another mineral. Mineral hardness is measured on a scale from 1 to 10 with 1 being the softest and 10 the hardest.



Mohs' Hardness Scale.

- 1. Talc
- 2. Gypsum
- 3. Calcite
- 4. Fluorite
- 5. Apatite
- 6. Orthoclase Feldspar
- 7. Quartz
- 8. Topaz
- 9. Corundum
- 10. Diamond

The hardness scale was developed

by the German mineralogist Carl Friedrich Christian Mohs (January 29, 1773 – September 29, 1839). Friedrich Mohs,


Euler's Formula - Leonhard Euler was a mathematician from Switzerland who lived from 1707 to 1783. He is famous for his many mathematical discoveries. To understand the theorem, you have to know the definition of word polyhedron. the polyhedron is a dimensional shape made up of flat faces (like crystal faces). A line (also called an edge) is formed where the faces meet each other and a point is formed where the edges meet each other. These points are called vertices.



Euler's Theorem: If you add the number of faces (call them "F") of a polyhedron to the number of its vertices (call them "V") and then subtract the number of edges (call them F+V-E=2"E"), you will always get the number 2.


