The Catawba
Valley Gem and Mineral
Club will hold their fortyfifth annual gem, mineral,
fossil, and jewelry show on
MARCH 27, 28, and 29,
2015 at the Hickory
Metro Convention

Center. Hours are 9:00 a.m. till 6:00 p.m. on Friday, 9:00 a.m. till 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, and 10:00 a.m. till 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. Chaperoned school, boy or girl scouts, 4-H, church youth, day care, retirement home groups, and law enforcement officers in uniform will be admitted free anytime during this 3-day event. The Eastern Federation of Mineralogical and Lapidary Societies Convention will be held in conjunction with the 2015 show. The show will also be held in memory of Terry Ledford, a past vendor and rock hound killed in a mining accident in Hiddenite.

The show theme is "Somewhere in the Rainbow." The show will provide the opportunity to view many once-in-a-lifetime gems. "Somewhere in the Rainbow" is a privately owned collection from the Phoenix, Arizona area. This collection, valued at over \$10,000,000, first started in 2008 with the purchase of several world-class faceted stones. The focus of this collection is to make the collection accessible to the public for educational purposes through exhibits in many venues. A portion of this collection will be available for your viewing at the convention; an exceptional opportunity to see such rare gems. This will be the first showing East of the Mississippi. Many of the items are equal to or exceed the quality of gems and minerals found in the Smithsonian.

An education area will house hands-on displays and demonstrations of the lapidary arts of faceting, cabachon cutting, and tumbling. An area with black lights will allow visitors to see fluorescent minerals. Younger children will enjoy searching for free specimens at a sand table. Participants are invited to bring gem and mineral samples for identification at a booth in the education area staffed by a geologist. Over twenty vendors will be on hand to sell during the show.

Drawings for regular door prizes will be held every hour. The club will be selling grab bags containing minerals and fossils for \$1.00 each. Cost of admission is \$5.00 which will allow admission for all three days of the show.

PURPOSE OF THE SHOW

The purpose of our show is to bring you the finest in displays of gem and mineral specimens for your appreciation as well as education. You may not know it, but you may have gemstones in your own back yard.

North Carolina is rich in precious and semiprecious minerals. We wish to make you more aware of this fact. This show is for you as a novice or as an experienced collector.

You may just observe or you may wish to buy or trade a fine specimen. After you have seen all, you may wish to become more involved in this fast-growing, world-wide hobby. Let us welcome you as a "rockhound."


